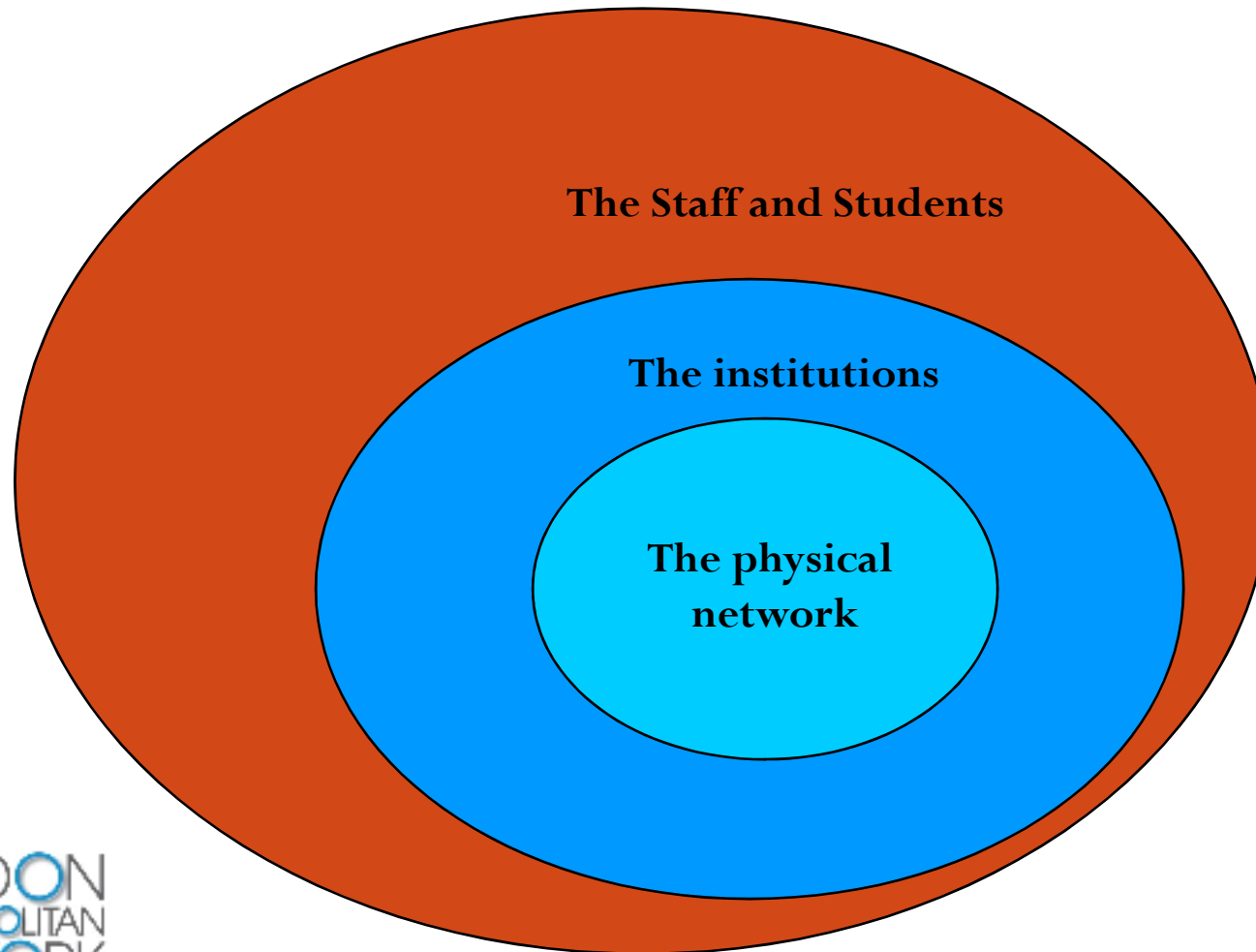
- **LMN - a gigabit network for education in London**
